Supporting Offenders into Employment

We are committed to help reduce the overall impact of COVID-19 by improving future opportunities and wellbeing for offenders.

COVID-19 Budget Package 2020

We will improve opportunities for offenders through longterm employment support.

The Government is providing over \$12 million for the continuation of a cross-agency initiative focusing on early intervention, with intensive client management to provide offenders with long-term support, from release to achieving 12 months sustainable employment.

- This initiative will also extend existing services to people on remand awaiting their court appearance and who were previously in employment.
- It will also improve prison release processes between Corrections and the Ministry of Social Development (MSD).
- We expect unemployment levels to increase due to COVID-19 and that there will be an inequitable increase in Māori unemployment (60% of released prisoners identify as Māori). This initiative will provide much needed extra wrap-around support to released offenders and their whānau.
- This initiative will also improve internal reporting across MSD systems and monitoring, as well as internal reporting across MSD and Corrections.

Employment is considered one of the biggest factors to reduce re-offending. Studies show that released prisoners who maintain stable employment are significantly less likely to re-offend. This initiative offers long-term employment support starting from in prison, through to when sustainable 12-month employment has been achieved.

Evidence shows that 91% of prisoners have a mental health issue and 60% have children. Providing offenders with an intensive case management service to guide them back into the community and a positive employment pathway, will make a difference to not only themselves but their whānau.
