The Government has invested \$59.6 million in expanding the successful Skills for Industry programme to help close the skills gap and provide employment opportunities in the construction sector.

- The Ministry of Social Development's (MSD) Skills for Industry course has proven effective in providing training to create a pathway for jobseekers into construction related employment.
- MSD's partners have identified projects across the country that need people working on them as soon as possible.

- This funding will provide among other opportunities:
 - 800 training places in the Kiwi Can Do programme
 - 800 training places to support the New Zealand Upgrade Programme (NZUP) "Fast Five" and National Land Transport Programme (NLTP) supplier partnerships
 - 250 training places to meet initial demand from national partners for 'shovel ready' projects
 - 550 places to expand Ngā Puna Pūkenga – a partnership with the Auckland Council for 'shovel ready' opportunities
 - Up to 1,150 training places for the new Mayors Taskforce for Jobs initiative to provide employment recovery support to local councils.
- This funding also supports the national coordination and delivery of Industry Partnerships, including supporting MSD regional engagement for employment outcomes.
