
1. Anticipated Cases

400,000


people will contract COVID-19 in 2022.



Cases rise exponentially once more than **500** and peak at **5,000** cases/day.



Peak is sustained for seven weeks.



2. Number of people required to self-isolate

For **every case**, an additional **4** people are required to self-isolate on average in addition to the positive case.

(calculated using Auckland isolation vs positive cases in January)



3. Number of households required to self-isolate under section 70 notice

Using household census results from 2018, extrapolated to 2021 estimate and average household size at the SA2 level.



4. Who requires welfare assistance?




