On 21 June 2023, the Cabinet Social Wellbeing Committee:

Background

noted that the Ministry of Social Development (MSD) is anticipating departmental output expense underspends in 2022/23 as follows:

- noted that the transfers sought in principle below total \$33.301 million, consisting of \$23.041 million from MSD departmental underspends, \$3.760 million from other Ministries and departmental agencies, and \$6.000 million from the Food Secure Programmes and \$0.500 million from Community Support Services departmental underspends;

Food Secure Communities cost pressure

- noted that Budget 2023 approved funding for "Food Secure Communities", to continue some elements of the existing Food Secure Communities programme and in response to the North Island Weather Events (funding in 2023/24 \$17.800 million and 2024/25 \$11 million), but the demand for the programme in 2023/24 is expected to exceed the allocated funding level;
- noted that MSD is anticipating underspends in 2022/23 for the Food Secure Communities programmes of \$6 million and \$0.500 million from general underspends in the Community Support Services MCA as follows:
