On 13 June 2016 the Ministry received your request, under the Official Information Act 1982, the following information:

- The number of Child Disability Allowance applications that were received in the East Coast region over the past five years.
- The number that were approved.
- The number that were declined.

Child Disability Allowance (CDA) is a non-taxable allowance available to the primary caregiver of a child who is diagnosed with a physical, sensory, psychiatric or intellectual disability. CDA is paid at a standard rate and is not income tested. It is usually paid to the primary carer in recognition of the extra care they provide to a child with a severe medical condition compared to that required for a child of a similar age who is not impaired. It is not related to any particular financial costs incurred in relation to the child's disability.

People may also be eligible to receive a Disability Allowance to meet any additional costs the dependent child may have due to their disability. Disability Allowance is an income tested, non-taxable form of financial assistance available to people and their dependent children who have on-going additional costs resulting from a disability.

A number of factors are considered when assessing a person's eligibility. However, a person will be declined an allowance if they do not meet the eligibility criteria set out by the Ministry. ## Note:

- CDA is paid to the principal caregiver for a child with a serious disability and who needs constant care and attention e.g. physical, sensory, psychiatric or intellectual disability.
- CDA is paid at a standard rate and is not income tested.
- CDA can be paid to partners and primary clients in their own right.
- East Coast region consists of the Flaxmere, Gisborne, Hastings, Kaiti, Napier, Ruatoria, Taradale, Waipukurau and Wairoa Service Centres.
- This represents a count of grants not individuals as the same person may have been granted a benefit more than once.
