



On 13 June 2016 you emailed the Ministry requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982, the following information:

• Breakdown of benefit numbers for European Ethnic Group and Asian ethnic group from 2003 onwards.

As communicated to you on 15 June 2016 the Ministry of Social Development is able to provide you with an 'Other Ethnicity' category breakdown from the benefit factsheets which includes Chinese, Indian, Other European and Other. However, the Ministry is unable to provide 'European' and 'Asian' as the Ministry does not report on these groups specifically.

To meet the public interest in benefit uptake, the Ministry publishes quarterly national and regional benefit factsheets on its website which provide information on all working age people receiving main benefits, as well as an overall view of recent trends. This information can be accessed on the Ministry's website www.msd.govt.nz.

Please find enclosed a table in response to your request. The table provides information on the number of working age people in receipt of a main benefit, broken down by ethnic group, as at the end of March 2003 to the end of March 2016.

Please note that Asian includes clients who identify themselves as Chinese or Indian. There may be clients who identify themselves as other Asian ethnicities, which will be included under 'Other' and not the Asian ethnic group.

It is not mandatory for clients to identify their ethnicity. The group 'Other' includes those who have not identified an ethnicity and those where no ethnicity is recorded. It is important to note that the Ministry is only able to report on the primary ethnicity of Work and Income clients which may not be their only ethnicity.
