On 5 August 2016 you emailed the Ministry requesting the following information:

- *Which of the Family Violence Networks received funding in Vote Social Development 2016?*
- *The amount of funding for each Network*
- *Was there any government funding in addition to this Vote Social Development expenditure on the Networks?*

The Ministry of Social Development has funded family violence community coordination since 2003. The Family Violence Response Coordination (FVRC) fund was established in 2011 to continue to fund community coordination, now known as the Family Violence Networks in 40 locations. Budget 2016 provided \$2.8 million for the 2016/17 financial year, to allow the Ministry to extend current Family Violence Response Coordination for a further 12 months. During this time, these services will be considered as part of the Ministerial Group on Family Violence and Sexual Violence Work Programme, which focuses on getting victims the help they need, holding perpetrators to account, and working harder to stop these forms of violence from happening in the first place.

Family Violence Networks function across the prevention and crisis continuum in the following manner:

- **Prevention:** mobilising all layers of the communities to actively contribute to preventing violence in their community and leading community action to change attitudes and behaviours.
- **Early Identification and Intervention:** ensuring general services, whānau and community can respond safely and effectively and knowing where to go for help.
- **Crisis response and follow up:** leading government and community agencies to work better together to ensure individuals, whānau and families receive quality, consistent services that respond effectively to their needs (this often includes the Family Violence Interagency Response System FVIARS or similar).
- **Enhancing and improving the integrated system:** leading the strategic approach to addressing family violence for their communities by improving relationships, sharing information and driving workforce development and good practice.

You will find enclosed a table showing the \$2.8 million of Family Violence Network funding provided to each fund holder for the 2016/17 financial year. I have also

provided information regarding the amount of other funding provided by the Ministry to each of the fund holders. Please note that the other funding from the Ministry shown in the table is for the provision of a range of social services specific to each provider. These services are generally for direct service delivery for clients, and not for the support of Networks.

It is likely that the Networks will receive funding from other agencies, however any requests for that information should be directed to those agencies which may have funded these Networks.

The principles and purposes of the Official Information Act 1982 under which you made your request are:


- to create greater openness and transparency about the plans, work and activities of the Government,
