On 3 May 2019, you emailed the Ministry requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982, the following information:

- *The figures for the Gisborne region (including the East Coast like Ruatoria etc) for the amount of hardship assistance grants given out by the MSD for the past five years - broken into each quarter.*

The Ministry, through Work and Income, provides recoverable and non-recoverable financial assistance to help people meet an immediate need for essential items including food, health costs and power.

These payments are available to any person that meets the income and asset test criteria, and they are unable to meet the cost for an essential need from any other source. Work and Income also ensures that people receive their correct entitlement to any other financial assistance as part of the application and assessment process.

Work and Income assists people in managing their costs long term, not just with immediate and urgent assistance. It is important to understand why the client cannot meet these costs, in order to provide the most appropriate form of assistance. This can include helping them find other avenues of assistance such as from their District Health Board. The applicant also has an obligation to manage their own finances with the help of Work and Income. This may include seeking financial advice from budgeting services.

Please find enclosed Table One which provides figures around the number of Advance Payment of Benefit (ADV), Special Needs Grants (SNG) and Recoverable Assistance Payment (RAP) and amounts approved in the Gisborne, Kaiti and Ruatoria Work and Income service centres during the last five calendar years ending December 2018 and the March 2019 quarter, broken down by quarter, reason group and amount.
