On 27 September 2020, you emailed the Ministry of Social Development (the Ministry) requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982, the following information between 27 March 2020 and 18 September 2020:

- 1. How many grants of Jobseeker Work Ready were made to people who had lost employment?
- 2. How many grants of Jobseeker Health Condition or Disability were made to people who had lost employment?
- 3. How many grants of Covid-19 Income Relief Payment were made to people who had lost employment?
- 4. How many grants of Youth/Young Parent Payment were made to people who had lost employment?
- 5. How many grants of other main benefits were made to people who had lost employment?

On 2 October 2020, you informed the Ministry that you were happy to receive data for clients who required a benefit for the reason of 'Ceased Work'. Additionally, you informed the Ministry that you were happy to receive the data from the March, June and September 2020 quarters, because that best captured the timeframe you were after.

Jobseeker Support (JS) is a temporary benefit paid for up to 52 weeks while clients look for work, are in training for work or unable to work due to a health condition, injury or disability. JS Work Ready grants, however, refer solely to those JS clients who are available for and seeking full-time employment. JS Health Condition or Disability grants refer solely to those JS clients who have a health condition, injury or disability. The client must meet certain medical qualifications.

Please note, in regard to question five, the 'Other Main Benefits' included in **Table One** are the Emergency Benefit, Emergency Maintenance Allowances, Jobseeker Support Student Hardship, Supported Living Payment, Sole Parent Support. In regard to question three, on 25 May 2020, the Government announced a new temporary payment called the COVID-19 Income Relief Payment (CIRP) to support New Zealanders who lost their jobs due to the global COVID-19 pandemic.

The CIRP was made available for 12 weeks from 8 June 2020, to anyone who had lost their job due to the impact of COVID-19 since 1 March 2020. It paid \$490 per week to those who lost full-time work and \$250 per week for those who lost part-time work.

If a New Zealander ceased their employment (including self-employment) from 1 March 2020 to 30 October 2020 due to COVID-19, they could apply for a CIRP from 8 June 2020. Therefore, the Ministry is unable to provide you with CIRP data for the March 2020 quarter. Furthermore, your request for this information is declined under section 18(e) of the Official Information Act, as it is does not exist.

On 2 October 2020, the Ministry informed you that the Ministry only granted New Zealanders a CIRP if they 'Ceased Work'. However, to be helpful, the Ministry has provided the following CIRP data broken down by the June and September 2020 quarters, as the information publicly available on the website is broken down by week and month. Please find the following table attached to this response in Appendix One:

Finally, in regard to question four, the Youth Payment is for 16 and 17-year-old young people who have no dependent children and are either not being supported by their parent or are, or have been, married, in a civil union, or in a de facto relationship. The Young Parent Payment is a benefit for 16 to 19-year-old young people who have a dependent child or children and are either single or are, or have been, married, in a civil union, or in a de facto relationship.
