On 5 March 2022, you emailed the Ministry of Social Development (the Ministry) requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act), the following information related to the Office for Disability Issues (ODI):

- Copies of all advice tendered from the Office of Disability Issues to Ministers and Government Agencies in respect of the Government's preparation work for the Omicron outbreak in Aotearoa (this should include advice tendered in respect of the covid protection framework introduced in 3 December 2021 and any related legislation, regulation and policy instruments);
- Without limiting the scope of number 1 above, I would like all information tendered by your office to Ministers and Government Officials about the Caring in Community Initiatives, including the community hubs being established.
- In respect of the above, I am particularly interested in advice given by your office about the potential risks and impacts of widespread Covid cases to disabled people and how the Government could mitigate these.
- I am also seeking any information requests on the risks and Government mitigations of the Omicron outbreak to disabled people that you have sought from the Ministry of Health, Ministry of Social Development and the Department of Prime Minister and Cabinet and an indication of whether you received a response to these requests.

Some information is withheld under section 9(2)(f)(iv) of the Act to maintain the constitutional conventions for the time being which protect the confidentiality of advice tendered by Ministers of the Crown and officials. The release of this information is likely to prejudice the ability of government to consider advice and the wider public interest of effective government would not be served.

The principles and purposes of the Official Information Act 1982 under which you made your request are:

- to create greater openness and transparency about the plans, work and activities of the Government,
- to increase the ability of the public to participate in the making and administration of our laws and policies and
- to lead to greater accountability in the conduct of public affairs.

This Ministry fully supports those principles and purposes. The Ministry therefore intends to make the information contained in this letter and any attached documents available to the wider public. The Ministry will do this by publishing this letter and attachments on the Ministry's website. Your personal details will be deleted, and the Ministry will not publish any information that would identify you as the person who requested the information.
