On 12 October 2022, you emailed the Ministry of Social Development (the Ministry) requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act), the following information:

- *Could you please provide a breakdown of the number and value (\$) of Special Needs Grants (SNGs) issued by the Wairarapa Community Link for the quarter ending 30 Sep 2022?*
- *Can this data please be provided per SNG category as per previous requests?*

Please see attached, **Appendix One** containing **Table One**, which shows the number and amount granted for Special Needs Grants from the Wairarapa Service Centre for the period 1 July 2022 to 30 September 2022.

You will note some of your requested need reasons do not appear in the table. This is because the Ministry did not receive any applications under those categories during the above quarter.

The principles and purposes of the Official Information Act 1982 under which you made your request are:

- to create greater openness and transparency about the plans, work and activities of the Government,
- to increase the ability of the public to participate in the making and administration of our laws and policies and
- to lead to greater accountability in the conduct of public affairs.

### Notes for Table:

- This is a count of grants not clients. A client may have multiple grants in a period.
- The amount granted may not be the same as the amount spent.

- Service centre is based on the Work and Income site where the recommending case manager for the application was based at the time of the grant.
- The 'Other' need reason includes Re-establishment Refugee (Other), Steps to freedom, Transfer to NZ Super, HSP Rent Arrears, NET Payment,
- Sole Parent Study Assistance, Ambulance Fees (Non-Subscription), Assistance during an initial stand down and/or application process, Seasonal Work Assistance, and Water Tank Refill
- To protect confidentiality the Ministry of Social Development uses processes to make it difficult to identify an individual person or entity from published data.
- These data tables have had random rounding to base three applied to all cell counts in the table.
- The impact of applying random rounding is that columns and rows may not add exactly to the given column or row totals.
- Random rounding does not round down to zero. A value of one or two will be rounded to three.
- The published counts will never differ by more than two counts.
