## **Official Information Act request**

On 17 June 2024, the Treasury transferred your request to the Ministry of Social Development (the Ministry) for response for any calculations of the cost to the New Zealand taxpayer of the British Government's policy of freezing its state pensions paid to New Zealand that this Ministry may have.

I have considered your request under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act). Please find my decision on your request set out below.

In 2016, the Ministry did conduct an exercise to calculate the costs and estimate of the additional expense to the United Kingdom (UK) of the paying index linked pensions into New Zealand. It was found that due to the effect of the direct deduction policy (under which UK state pensions are deducted from any pension or benefit a person receives) the additional expense for the UK would be a saving for New Zealand. The estimated additional expense for the UK was calculated at: (in New Zealand dollars):

- 2017/18 \$5.388m
- 2018/19 \$10.921m
- 2019/20 \$16.615m
- 2020/21 \$22.490m
- 2021/22 \$28.563m
