Official Information Act request

Thank you for your email of 21 August 2024 requesting information relating to tenant advocacy funding.

I have considered your request under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act). Please find my decision on your request set out below. For the sake of clarity, I will respond to your request in parts.

- 1. All documents, emails, and communications related to the decision-making process and discussions concerning funding for tenant advocacy, include but not limited to Manawatu Tenants Union, and the wider Tenants advocates network (TAN) or any other agencies that provided dedicated tenant advocacy and supports services for tenants including:
 - a. Any internal or external discussions, evaluations, or considerations regarding tenant funding.

Your request for this information is refused under section 18(e) of the Act as this document does not exist or, despite reasonable efforts to locate it, cannot be found.

b. Communications with the Ministry of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), Treasury, and other relevant government departments concerning tenant funding and advocacy.

Please find the information requested attached in **Appendix A**. Please note that staff contact details have been withheld under section 9(2)(a) of the Act to protect their privacy.

Some information has been withheld as out of scope of your request.

- 2. Details of dedicated funding and services available specifically for tenants, including:
 - a. A description of the funding streams available for tenant advocacy and support services.
 - b. The criteria and processes for allocating this funding.
 - *c.* Any recent changes or considerations for future changes to this funding.

The Ministry does not provide specific funding or services for Housing or Tenancy advocacy.

- 3. A list of organizations that receive funding from MSD to provide tenant advocacy and support services, including:
 - a. The names of the organizations & the regions they operate in.
 - b. The amount of funding each organization receives.
 - *c.* The specific services or programs provided by each organization to support tenants or tenancies.
 - *d.* The number of tenancies or tenants that have benefited for said services or programs.

As noted above, the Ministry does not provide specific funding or services for Housing or Tenancy advocacy. As such, this aspect of your request is refused under section 18(e) of the Act, as the information requested does not exist.

I will be publishing this decision letter, with your personal details deleted, on the Ministry's website in due course.

I hope you are keeping well.

I wanted to flag that I had received a call from Cam Jenkins at the Manawatu Tenancy Association concerning their ongoing funding issues. I reminded Cam that MSD had stepped into the breach last year only to provide time and space for HUD / Ministers to consider broader issues around funding of the Tenant Advocates Network, and that MSD funding was unlikely to be available in the new financial year - though ultimately that would be a decision for our regional commissioner to make given she sourced funds from her regional MCA.

Cam mentioned that TAN have their first meeting with the Minister of Housing scheduled for 14 May. It will come as no surprise to you that network funding, along with the re-introduction of nocause 90-day notices, will be top of mind for TAN when speaking with Minister Bishop. 

Kia ora Karen,

Just following up with some additional information about the funding request from the Manawatu Tenancy Union (MTU) for funding to allow them to continue supporting tenants and in many cases helping to sustain tenancies through provision of advice and support n situations that could lead to a tenant becoming homeless.

As far as we understand it MTU received the following funding (outlined below) from MSD previously but have been advised they won't be funded again in the current year. I understand they had a regional contact for this who has subsequently left MSD.



Could you have a look at whether this request could fit in to any of the homelessness prevention funding you hold or other options from the MSD end. If you would like to speak to MTU, contact details are below:

A number of other members of other Tenants Advocate Network such as Auckland Tenancy Protection Association, Citizens Advice Bureau and Community Law would likely also be interested in conversations about funding. All of these groups will be involved in supporting tenants to sustain their tenancies and access the supports they need. From the Conversation at the Minister's meeting MTU was at most risk of having to consider closing their doors.

It might be worth us having a general chat (across HUD, MSD and MBIE) around this gap and how the supports they provide contribute to preventing homelessness.

Kia ora Simone,

I had a discussion with Krysta about this, taking into account the recent payments against the Ready to Rent accruals there is no longer enough money left in remaining accrual to fund this, and as this is a ring-fenced product, (in Crown) we are not allowed to overspend in this area.

However, we do have a credit in the MCA against NI - New Initiative, (from a couple of Work Confidence programs we accrued funds for that did not end up getting utilised), the value of that credit is \$16,121.82

I think this may be a more appropriate source of the funds and as we have no further programs scheduled against NI this credit would otherwise be unused and offset against any overspends in other programs.

I really appreciate you giving this some thought.

Overnight, I was struck by one more funding avenue we might explore. Within the HAP funding there is an allocation for Ready to Rent courses, which are intended to give clients a better understanding of the their rights and obligations as tenants so they present well to landlords and property managers.

I understand the funding for the one-year extension of HAP supports, including R2R, has been allocated to regions (based largely on EH client volumes), but am unaware whether your team has yet contracted providers? If not, or if funding is not yet fully allocated then we could potentially *kill two birds with one stone* – i.e. we get R2R courses and they get to keep their doors open...

Just a thought for you to ponder.

Kia ora Simone,

I hope you are keeping well. I'm reaching out today to test your views on the situation outlined below in respect of the Manawatu Tenants Union (MTU), which is garnering some attention from housing ministers.

To summarise, MSD ended its historic funding arrangement with the Manawatu Tenants Union at the close of FY 2022/23 on the basis that HUD was to put up a Budget 2023 bid to establish a long-term funding mechanism to support the work of Tenants Advocacy Network members including MTU. That budget bid was, unfortunately, deprioritised following the North Island Weather Event, which has left a gap in MTU's operational funding (approx. \$16,800) which now threatens their ability to keep operating.

MTU have raised this with Minister Edmonds, in her capacity as Minister for Building and Construction and Associate Minister of Housing, who in turn has asked that agencies (including MSD) consider whether there is funding available to bridge this for the remainder of the financial year by which time HUD will have been able to progress their bid. I spoke with Cam Jenkins, Coordinator at MTU, yesterday to better understand their service and its potential alignment with our work yesterday – see my note below.

HUD have come up dry so after speaking with Karen and, more recently Paula who is acting in her absence, we wanted to test whether you would have any ability to pick up this funding, either under your MCA or potentially through your Homelessness Action Plan (HAP) funding allocation? We appreciate this is far from ideal but consider that MTU's work does contribute to keeping our clients safely housed and thus help to limit entries into emergency housing in the Manawatu so there may be a case for MSD to support on a temporary basis.

If it would be helpful, I am happy to jump on a call with your or your delegate to discuss this matter. In the meanwhile, it would be helpful to understand whether this is something you would, in principle, consider.

Kia ora Paula / Claire,

As promised, I contacted Cam Jenkins at Manawatu Tenants Union to discuss the funding situation noted

below.

To briefly recap the background for Paula... MTU deliver tenancy and advocacy service and advice in Palmerston North and across the wider Manawatu area with a strong focus on sustaining tenancies and supporting clients through the Tenancy Tribunal process. Currently, 80% of MTU funding comes from non-govt sources including, Lotteries Commission grants and private charitable donations. Through the end of the last financial year, MSD (Community Partnerships) provided funding of around \$16,000 p/a to support up to 1,000 client engagements each year. That financial support was not renewed for 2023/24 onwards in recognition of the fact that tenancy advocacy services align more closely with HUD's role and function, and that HUD intended to progress a Budget bid to bring funding for the Tenancy Advocacy Network, including MTU, under the one roof. Unfortunately that bid was reprioritised following the NIWE meaning that MTU (and potentially other members of the TAN) was left with a funding gap.

My conversation with Cam was largely open and positive. He acknowledged that, in the absence of a solution, it is likely the current funding gap would require MTU to reduce both its opening hours and the number of referrals they accept over the current financial year. Should the situation persist beyond this FY Cam thought it likely MTU would need to consider redundancies amongst their small staff or closing shop entirely. Cam was clear that a similar level of funding as previously provided by MSD (c. \$16k) would allow MTU to continue to deliver services with no drop off in capacity – he actually agreed that they could survive with as little as a \$10k injection. I acknowledged the difficult situation we find ourselves in (caught between the old funding arrangement and the new) and agreed to investigate potential funding MSD streams to see them through the next 12 months and come back to him by early next week with an update.

Conscious that Karen has acknowledged the value MTU deliver in helping to manage / limit the flow of people into emergency housing in Palmerton North by keeping them safely housed in a private tenancy, the following options may be open to us in terms of providing some 'bridging finance':

- **Regional Multi Category Appropriation:** MSD regional commissioners usually have a modest MCA with which they can support local community services and relationships. This option has some appeal because it provides a reasonable degree of flexibility and a relatively light administrative tail. However, this option would be dependent on i) securing the support of the regional commissioner, and ii) that she has money left in the bank far from a given.
- HAP Funding: MSD is currently funded to provide contracted support services (principally navigation services) to people living in emergency housing, and in limited situations to people at risk of homelessness. While current HAP funding has been fully allocated to our regions, it may be possible to reallocate any underspends to temporarily support MTU. It goes without saying that the start of the financial year is not generally the best time to go hunting for under-spends. I am also a little concerned that this option presents some risk to MSD in terms of alignment with the intent of the appropriation...

MSD Community Partnerships Funding: there may be an option seek funding through our Community Partnerships team, who hold the lion's share of MSD's contract funding. However, judging from my initial conversations with their GM (Mark Henderson), there is very limited appetite on their side to re-enter the housing space, having only just gotten rid of it so fear this may result in a 'long no'. Cam enquired about the possibility of securing funding through our Community Connector service, but that funding was only available through June 2023 and is primarily focused on NIWE-impacted areas.

NB. I appreciate it is a HUD programme, but I also wondered whether there was any scope to support MTU through the **Sustaining Tenancies** programme? Listening to Cam's descriptor of their service there seems to be a good degree of alignment between MTU's work and the intent of that programme.

I realise that I have unconsciously listed these options in order of ease of deliverability. Given the time constraints and level of ministerial interest that approach seems appropriate, although I do have some concern that meeting this request may create expectations (on MSD) from other providers.

Paula: in the first instance, I think we should sound out Simone / Central Region's views and determine whether there is any scope for them to pick this up – it's not ideal, but it would be timely and investing a ct 1981 little here may help them to keep their EH demand under control. Will discuss with you in the morning.

Kia ora Simone,

I hope you are keeping well. I'm reaching out today to test your views on the situation outlined below in respect of the Manawatu Tenants Union (MTU), which is garnering some attention from housing ministers.

To summarise, MSD ended its historic funding arrangement with the Manawatu Tenants Union at the close of FY 2022/23 on the basis that HUD was to put up a Budget 2023 bid to establish a long-term funding mechanism to support the work of Tenants Advocacy Network members including MTU. That budget bid was, unfortunately, deprioritised following the North Island Weather Event, which has left a gap in MTU's operational funding (approx. \$16,800) which now threatens their ability to keep operating.

MTU have raised this with Minister Edmonds, in her capacity as Minister for Building and Construction and Associate Minister of Housing, who in turn has asked that agencies (including MSD) consider whether there is funding available to bridge th s for the remainder of the financial year by which time HUD will have been able to progress their bid. I spoke with Cam Jenkins, Coordinator at MTU, yesterday to better understand their service and its potential alignment with our work yesterday – see my note below.

HUD have come up dry so after speaking with Karen and, more recently Paula who is acting in her absence, we wanted to test whether you would have any ability to pick up this funding, either under your MCA or potentially through your Homelessness Action Plan (HAP) funding allocation? We appreciate this is far from ideal but consider that MTU's work does contribute to keeping our clients safely housed and thus help to limit entries into emergency housing in the Manawatu so there may be a case for MSD to support on a temporary basis.

If it would be helpful, I am happy to jump on a call with your or your delegate to discuss this matter. In the meanwhile, it would be helpful to understand whether this is something you would, in principle, consider.

Kia ora Paula / Claire,

As promised, I contacted Cam Jenkins at Manawatu Tenants Union to discuss the funding situation noted below.

To briefly recap the background for Paula... MTU deliver tenancy and advocacy service and advice in Palmerston North and across the wider Manawatu area with a strong focus on sustaining tenancies and supporting clients through the Tenancy Tribunal process. Currently, 80% of MTU funding comes from non-govt sources including, Lotteries Commission grants and private charitable donations. Through the end of the last financial year, MSD (Community Partnerships) provided funding of around \$16,000 p/a to support up to 1,000 client engagements each year. That financial support was not renewed for 2023/24 onwards in recognition of the fact that tenancy advocacy services align more closely with HUD's role and function, and that HUD intended to progress a Budget bid to bring funding for the Tenancy Advocacy Network, including MTU, under the one roof. Unfortunately that bid was reprioritised following the NIWE meaning that MTU (and potentially other members of the TAN) was left with a funding gap.

My conversation with Cam was largely open and positive. He acknowledged that, in the absence of a solution, it is likely the current funding gap would require MTU to reduce both its opening hours and the number of referrals they accept over the current financial year. Should the situation persist beyond this FY Cam thought it likely MTU would need to consider redundancies amongst their small staff or closing shop entirely. Cam was clear that a similar level of funding as previously provided by MSD (c. \$16k) would allow MTU to continue to deliver services with no drop off in capacity – he actually agreed that they could survive with as little as a \$10k injection. I acknowledged the difficult situation we find ourselves in (caught between the old funding arrangement and the new) and agreed to investigate potential funding MSD streams to see them through the next 12 months and come back to him by early next week with an update.

Conscious that Karen has acknowledged the value MTU deliver in helping to manage / limit the flow of people into emergency housing in Palmerton North by keeping them safely housed in a private tenancy, the follow ng options may be open to us in terms of providing some 'bridging finance':

- **Regional Multi Category Appropriation:** MSD regional commissioners usually have a modest MCA with which they can support local community services and relationships. This option has some appeal because it provides a reasonable degree of flexibility and a relatively light administrative tail. However, this option would be dependent on i) securing the support of the regional commissioner, and ii) that she has money left in the bank far from a given.
- HAP Funding: MSD is currently funded to provide contracted support services (principally navigation services) to people living in emergency housing, and in limited situations to people at risk of homelessness. While current HAP funding has been fully allocated to our regions, it may be possible to reallocate any underspends to temporarily support MTU. It goes without saying that the start of the financial year is not generally the best time to go hunting for under-spends. I am also a

little concerned that this option presents some risk to MSD in terms of alignment with the intent of the appropriation...

• MSD Community Partnerships Funding: there may be an option seek funding through our Community Partnerships team, who hold the lion's share of MSD's contract funding. However, judging from my initial conversations with their GM (Mark Henderson), there is very limited appetite on their side to re-enter the housing space, having only just gotten rid of it so fear this may result in a 'long no'. Cam enquired about the possibility of securing funding through our Community Connector service, but that funding was only available through June 2023 and is primarily focused on NIWE-impacted areas.

NB. I appreciate it is a HUD programme, but I also wondered whether there was any scope to support MTU through the **Sustaining Tenancies** programme? Listening to Cam's descriptor of their service there seems to be a good degree of alignment between MTU's work and the intent of that programme.

I realise that I have unconsciously listed these options in order of ease of deliverability. Given the time constraints and level of ministerial interest that approach seems appropriate, although I do have some concern that meeting this request may create expectations (on MSD) from other providers.

Paula: in the first instance, I think we should sound out Simone / Central Region s views and determine whether there is any scope for them to pick this up – it's not ideal, but it would be timely and investing a little here may help them to keep their EH demand under control. Will discuss with you in the morning.

Kia ora Claire,

Thanks for providing us line of sight of your response.

I have discussed with Anne, who is currently leading the Housing Group at MSD, and we re not comfortable with the implication that MSD could fund tenancy advocacy services on an on-going basis. As you're likely aware, our housing support service funding is closely tied to those in receipt of the emergency housing special needs grant (EHSNG) thus there is very little scope for MSD to pick up MTU or TAN core-funding, at least through the housing programme.

You may have seen that MSD received additional funding to continue delivering EH support services to clients via Budget 2024. There may be an option to connect Cam / MTU with our Central region to discuss their interest in delivering either housing navigator support or rental readiness programmes, both of which would align to an extent with MTU's skill-set. That may help to offset the loss of core-funding but would also come with additional expectations over their current BAU workload.

I have inserted some draft wording building on the option above for your consideration and have looped in Darlene, our Regional Commissioner (Central) for information.



Kia ora Scott,

As promised, I contacted Cam early last week to discuss the funding situation noted below.

My conversation with Cam was largely open and positive. He acknowledged that, in the absence of a solution, it is likely the current funding gap would require MTU to reduce both its opening hours and the number of referrals they accept over the current financial year. Should the situation persist beyond this FY Cam thought it and agreed to investigate potential funding MSD streams (to see MTU through the next 12 months) and come back to him this week. Subsequently, I reached out to our Regional Commissioner, Simone Pringle, who has indicated she is open to the idea of picking up the funding through the remainder of the current financial year. So, not a cast iron guarantee, but a sign we are moving in the right direction. We will just need to work through the details to ensure this support can be provided within the limits of our appropriation.

I am hoping to speak further with Simone today / tomorrow in the hopes of being able to confirm with Cam before the end of the week.

Key Factors Impacting Performance Measures

The numbers remain within expected bounds for what we have seen traditionally, although represent a decline from the record contacts and tenant numbers since Covid. We have devoted more time and effort to engage with events and seminars than we have previously, which does mean less time in the office, but also more opportunity for outreach and education to reduce the chances of tenancy issues arising in the first instance. However, with the move of the Feilding Community Library, our ability to do outreach clinics there has been limited.

Approaches to Improve or Accelerate Performance

We have put more focus on education seminars for other organisations and additional efforts in media and government submissions. These contribute to rising awareness of our organisation across diverse communities, while also acting on upcoming tenancy changes.

Non-reporting or Variances in Reporting

We have ongoing difficulty reliably getting feedback after engaging with tenants with a provided survey. We are getting more success through email or phone queries that are less formal and relatively brief. We have also engaged in relatively more events and seminars than in previous years, which produce other interactions that do not mesh as well with our usual outcomes reporting.

Selected Case Work Narratives

Termination of a Tenancy Due to Safety Concerns

The tenancy of a group of students in a newly rented property with a fixed term agreement found themselves in a tumultuous relationship with their neighbours. What began as minor disturbances swiftly escalated into threats of physical violence and aggressive pounding on their doors, leaving them feeling vulnerable and unsafe in their own home. Faced with an untenable situation; after informing the property owner, the students chose to vacate the property and move into alternative accommodation. However, the property owner pursued the tenants for a continuation of the tenancy through the Tenancy Tribunal

The students initially visited the local Labour MP who directed them us. We supported the tenants in collecting necessary evidence and helped them to formulate their arguments. The Tenancy Tribunal ruled to terminate the tenancy with a nominal extension due to the safety concerns. After which, no more rent would be required.

Unlawful Termination

A tenant had a dispute with their flatmate regarding noise. The flatmate in return went to the property owner to complain about smelling marijuana under the tenant's door. The property owner issued a termination notice for use of illegal substances. The tenant informed the property owner that they hold a valid medical prescription for marijuana use and provided this to them, however the notice was not withdrawn. At this point, the tenant visited us to discuss their rights.

We advised that the tenant could dispute this termination yet would likely need to go through Tenancy Tribunal as the property owner rejected their medical documentation. They then called Tenancy Services the next day and were given contrary information. Following a second visit, we reaffirmed our advice that the notice could be disputed, otherwise they would need to move on. The tenant chose to dispute the notice feeling that the property owner had been unjust. They also actively sought alternative accommodation as a precautionary measure.

The Tenancy Tribunal recognised the tenant's rights, affirming that the landlord's actions were in breach of their obligations. The Tribunal granted compensation and exemplary damages of \$1,500 with anonymity for the tenant. The amount awarded was limited as the tenant had already found and moved into alternative housing.

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Bond Dispute Leading to Better Property Owner Practice

A tenant at the end of her three-year tenancy faced a bond dispute. When she left, the property needed a thorough cleaning, and the tenant was worried about the potential financial repercussions. The property owner claimed additional deductions for empty gas bottles that had already paid for and the removal of a minor alteration of replacing a door lock We began with ensuring that the tenant understood her responsibilities regarding the property's cleanliness and the property owner's inability to make unreasonable claims on the bond We helped the tenant gather evidence that she had already paid for the gas bottles. For the door lock, we helped the tenant draft a letter outlining the agreement and emphasised that the replacement of the door lock was an improvement to the property.

Then we accompanied the tenant to a mediation, where she was able to confidently and calmy present the evidence. The property owner reviewed the evidence and acknowledged his mistakes, agreeing to reduce his claim on the bond significantly. Seven days later, the tenant received her bond back and gave us a box of chocolates as a thank you. "I'm so grateful for all the help you provided. I couldn't have done it without you."


House Sale and Termination

A tenant was a family of six with children under five, had settled into a home with a 12-month fixed-term tenancy, which they extended for an additional six months, based on the property owner's promise of renewal. However, the property owner issued a 90-day notice of termination, informing them that the property was going on the market. Despite the difficulty to find somewhere new, the tenant worked and managed to find a new home after 2 weeks. With the well-being of their children as their priority, they decided to move into the new property immediately, ensuring they would not face homelessness.

The property owner demanded the tenant pay rent until the end of the original tenancy period. This demand seemed unreasonable considering the property owner's advantage of selling the property sooner than anticipated, as the settlement date and new owner moving in was able to be 6 weeks earlier. At the least, the property owner should not be able to demand more than 28-days. We thus helped the tenant gather evidence showing that the early move-out facilitated the sale of the property, benefiting the property owner financially, and helped to draft a letter to highlight this to be presented at an upcoming mediation. "We couldn't have navigated this without your help. You stood by us and ensured we were treated fairly."



The cold and wet weather this winter has contributed to highlighting failures of maintenance and shortfalls in the Healthy Homes. These factors have meant the high rate of lack of repairs being brought to our attention, although the proportion has not significantly exceeded the previous two years. Disputes over bonds and terminations have rearisen as pressing issues, some requiring Tenancy Tribunal involvement. Rent increases continue to remain relatively low and we suspect that the worst of these have already happened.

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In the first half of 2024 we have seen an increase in the number of issues experienced by tenants again. The increase has remained significantly less than the spike following Covid but remains consistent with the higher rates with housing maintaining political traction in recent years. Given the approaching deadline to the Heathy Homes Standards, we cannot be certain if this is a trend that will continue or another temporary increase.

Overnight, I was struck by one more funding avenue we might explore. Within the HAP funding there is an allocation for Ready to Rent courses, which are intended to give clients a better understanding of the their rights and obligations as tenants so they present well to landlords and property managers.

I understand the funding for the one-year extension of HAP supports, including R2R, has been allocated to regions (based largely on EH client volumes), but am unaware whether your team has yet contracted providers? If not, or if funding is not yet fully allocated then we could potentially *kill two birds with one stone* – i.e. we get R2R courses and they get to keep their doors open...

Kia ora Simone,

I hope you are keeping well. I'm reaching out today to test your views on the situation outlined below in respect of the Manawatu Tenants Union (MTU), which is garnering some attention from housing ministers.

To summarise, MSD ended its historic funding arrangement with the Manawatu Tenants Union at the close of FY 2022/23 on the basis that HUD was to put up a Budget 2023 bid to establish a long-term funding mechanism to support the work of Tenants Advocacy Network members including MTU. That budget bid was, unfortunately, deprioritised following the North Island Weather Event, which has left a gap in MTU's operational funding (approx. \$16,800) which now threatens their ability to keep operating.

MTU have raised this with Minister Edmonds, in her capacity as Minister for Building and Construction and Associate Minister of Housing, who in turn has asked that agencies (including MSD) consider whether there is funding available to bridge this for the remainder of the financial year by which time HUD will have been able to progress their bid. I spoke with Cam Jenkins, Coordinator at MTU, yesterday to better understand their service and its potential alignment with our work yesterday – see my note below.

HUD have come up dry so after speaking with Karen and, more recently Paula who is acting in her absence, we wanted to test whether you would have any ability to pick up this funding, either under your MCA or potentially through your Homelessness Action Plan (HAP) funding allocation? We appreciate this is far from ideal but consider that MTU's work does contribute to keeping our clients safely housed and thus help to limit entries into emergency housing in the Manawatu so there may be a case for MSD to support on a temporary basis.

If it would be helpful, I am happy to jump on a call with your or your delegate to discuss this matter. In the meanwhile, it would be helpful to understand whether this is something you would, in principle, consider.

Kia ora Paula / Claire,

As promised, I contacted Cam Jenkins at Manawatu Tenants Union to discuss the funding situation noted below.

To briefly recap the background for Paula... MTU deliver tenancy and advocacy service and advice in Palmerston North and across the wider Manawatu area with a strong focus on sustaining tenancies and supporting clients through the Tenancy Tribunal process. Currently, 80% of MTU funding comes from non-govt sources including, Lotteries Commission grants and private charitable donations. Through the end of the last financial year, MSD (Community Partnerships) provided funding of around \$16,000 p/a to support up to 1,000 client engagements each year. That financial support was not renewed for 2023/24 onwards in recognition of the fact that tenancy advocacy services align more closely with HUD's role and function, and that HUD intended to progress a Budget bid to bring funding for the Tenancy Advocacy Network, including MTU, under the one roof. Unfortunately that bid was reprioritised following the NIWE meaning that MTU (and potentially other members of the TAN) was left with a funding gap.

My conversation with Cam was largely open and positive. He acknowledged that, in the absence of a solution, it is likely the current funding gap would require MTU to reduce both its opening hours and the number of referrals they accept over the current financial year. Should the situation persist beyond this FY Cam thought it likely MTU would need to consider redundancies amongst their small staff or closing shop entirely. Cam was clear that a similar level of funding as previously provided by MSD (c. \$16k) would allow MTU to continue to deliver services with no drop off in capacity – he actually agreed that they could survive with as little as a \$10k injection. I acknowledged the difficult situation we find ourselves in (caught between the old funding arrangement and the new) and agreed to investigate potential funding MSD streams to see them through the next 12 months and come back to him by early next week with an update.

Listening to Cam's descriptor of their service there seems to be a good degree of alignment between MTU's work and the intent of that programme.

I realise that I have unconsciously listed these options in order of ease of deliverabili y. Given the time constraints and level of ministerial interest that approach seems appropriate, although I do have some concern that meeting this request may create expectations (on MSD) from other providers.



I really appreciate you giving this some thought.

Overnight, I was struck by one more funding avenue we might explore. Within the HAP funding there is an allocation for Ready to Rent courses, which are intended to give clients a better understanding of the their rights and obligations as tenants so they present well to landlords and property managers.

I understand the funding for the one-year extension of HAP supports, including R2R, has been allocated to regions (based largely on EH client volumes), but am unaware whether your team has yet contracted providers? I hope you are keeping well. I'm reaching out today to test your views on the situation outlined below in respect of the Manawatu Tenants U ion MTU), which is garnering some attention from housing ministers.

To summarise, MSD ended its historic funding arrangement with the Manawatu Tenants Union at the close of FY 2022/23 on the b sis tha HUD was to put up a Budget 2023 bid to establish a long-term funding mechanism to support the work of Tenants Advocacy Network members including MTU. That budget bid was, unfortunately, deprioritised following the North Island Weather Event, which has left a gap in MTU's operational funding (approx. \$16,800) which now threatens their ability to keep opera ing.

MTU have raised this with Minister Edmonds, in her capacity as Minister for Building and Construction and Associate Min ster f Housing, who in turn has asked that agencies (including MSD) consider whether there is funding available to bridge this for the remainder of the financial year by which time HUD will have been able to progress their bid. I spoke with Cam Jenkins, Coordinator at MTU, yesterday to better understand their service and its potential alignment with our work yesterday - ee my note below.

HUD have come up dry so after speaking with Karen and, more recently Paula who is acting in her absen e w wanted to test whether you would have any ability to pick up this funding, either under your MCA or potentially through your Homelessness Action Plan (HAP) funding allocation? We pp ec ate this is far from ideal but consider that MTU's work does contribute to keeping our clients safely housed and thus help to limit entries into emergency housing in the Manawatu so there may be a case for MSD to support on a temporary basis.

If it would be helpful, I am happy to jump on a call with your or your delegate to discuss this m tter. n the meanwhile, it would be helpful to understand whether this is something you would, in principle, consider.

Kia ora Paula / Claire,

As promised, I contacted Cam Jenkins at Manawatu Tenants Union to discuss the funding situation noted below

To briefly recap the background for Paula... MTU deliver tenancy and advocacy service and advice in Palmerston North and across the wider Manawatu area with a strong focus on sustaining tenancies and supporting clients through the Tenancy Tribunal process. Currently, 80% of MTU funding comes from non-govt sources including, Lotteries Commission grants and private charit ble d nations. Through the end of the last financial year, MSD (Community Partnerships) provided funding of around \$16,000 p/a to support up to 1,000 client engagements each year Tha financial support was not renewed for 2023/24 onwards in recognition of the fact that tenancy advocacy services align more closely with HUD's role and function, and that HUD intended o progress a Budget bid to bring funding for the Tenancy Advocacy Network, including MTU, under the one roof. Unfortunately that bid was reprioritised following the NIWE meaning that M U (and potentially other members of the TAN) was left with a funding gap.

My conversation with Cam was largely open and positive. He acknowledged that, in the absence of a solution, it is likely the current funding gap would require MTU to reduce both its opening hours and the number of referrals they accept over the current financial year. Should the situation persist beyond this FY Cam thought it likely MTU would need to consider redundancies amongst their small staff or closing shop entirely. Cam was clear that a similar level of funding as previously provided by MSD (c. \$16k) would allow MTU to continue to deliver services with no drop off in capacity - he actually agreed that they could survive with as little as a \$10k injection. I acknowledged the difficult situation we find ourselves in (caught between the old funding arrangement and the new) and agreed to investigate potential funding MSD streams to see them through the next 12 months and come back to him by early next week with an update.

Conscious that Karen has acknowledged the value MTU deliver in helping to manage / limit the flow of people into emergency housing in Palmerton North by keeping them safely housed in a private tenancy, the following options may be open to us in terms of providing some 'bridging finance':

- Regional Multi Category Appropriation: MSD regional commissioners usually have a modest MCA with which they can support local community services and relationships. This option has some appeal because it provides a reasonable degree of flexibility and a relatively light administrative tail. However, this option would be dependent on i) securing the support of the regional commissioner, and ii) that she has money left in the bank - far from a given
- HAP Funding: MSD is currently funded to provide contracted support services (principally navigation services) to people living in emergency housing, and in limited situations to people at risk of homelessness. While current HAP funding has been fully allocated to our regions, it may be possible to reallocate any underspends to temporarily support MTU. It goes without saying that the start of the financial year is not generally the best time to go hunting for under-spends. I am also a little concerned that this option presents some risk to MSD in terms of alignment with the intent of the appropriation ..

 MSD Community Partnerships Funding: there may be an option seek funding through our Community Partnerships team, who hold the lion's share of MSD's contract funding. However, judging from my initial conversations with their GM (Mark Henderson), there is very limited appetite on their side to re-enter the housing space, having only just gotten rid of it so fear this may result in a 'long no'. Cam enquired about the possibility of securing funding through our Community Connector service, but that funding was only available through June 2023 and is primarily focused on NIWE-impacted areas.

NB. I appreciate it is a HUD programme, but I also wondered whether there was any scope to support MTU through the Sustaining Tenancies programme? Listening to Cam's descriptor of their service there seems to be a good degree of alignment between MTU's work and the intent of that programme

I realise that I have unconsciously listed these options in order of ease of deliverability. Given the time constraints and level of ministerial interest that approach seems appropriate, although I do have some concern that meeting this request may create expectations (on MSD) from other providers.

Paula: in the first instance, I think we should sound out Simone / Central Region's views and determine whether there is any scope for them to pick this up – it's not ideal, but it would be timely and investing a little here may help them to keep their EH demand under control. Will discuss with you in the morning.

Dear Cam

Thank you for your email dated 23 April 2024 with your recommendations regarding the changes to the Residential Tenancies Act 1986 (RTA), and for meeting with me on 22 May, as part of the Tenants Advocate Network.

IN-CONFIDENCE

The Government is making changes to the RTA to encourage more landlords to enter the rental property market and apply downward pressure on rents.

Thank you for carefully considering our announced policies and providing your suggestions on how you think they can be improved. The Residential Tenancies Amendment Bill had its first reading on 21 May and was referred to the Social Services and Community Committee for consideration and is now open for public submissions until 3 July. As discussed in the Tenant Advocates Network meeting, I encourage you to make a submission on your views.

You raised the issue of funding for tenancy advocacy. The government recognises the valuable role that tenant advocacy organisations play in supporting renters. Tenant advocate funding is an operational matter for your organisation to work through with the appropriate officials at the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment, and the Ministry of Social Development.

It may also interest to know that Budget 2024 allocated new funding to the Ministry of Social Development to support people in emergency housing to access suitable, long-term housing. This includes contracted housing navigator services and rental readiness programmes. While MSD does not generally fund tenant advocacy services you may wish to contact the Ministry to discuss the potential alignment between those opportunities and the services delivered by MTU.

You have also raised the issue of the regulation of residential property managers. The Residential Property Managers Bill was introduced under the previous government and is currently being considered by the Social Services and Community Committee. The government has decided that we do not intend to support the Residential Property Managers Bill through further parliamentary stages.

The previous government's analysis of the proposed regulatory regime showed that the costbenefit analysis was very marginal, with a ratio of 1.07:1.0. The analysis also noted that the results were subject to significant uncertainty, especially in relation to incremental benefits, with the most certain aspect being the costs.

As discussed at the TAN meeting, I am interested to hear your thoughts on what a light touch regulatory model for the property management sector could look like.

Thank you again for writing to me on these important issues.
