Official Information Act request

Thank you for your email of 2 August 2024, requesting the following information:

- 1. Copies of any communications between the Taranaki Regional Public Service Commissioner, Gloria Campbell or members of her regional team and anyone from Housing and Urban Development relating to housing issues and/or opportunities in the Taranaki Region, over the past 24 months, including any meeting notes or minutes.
- 2. Copies of any communications between the Taranaki Regional Public Service Commissioner, Gloria Campbell or members of her regional team and police or other government departments related to rough sleepers or homeless in Taranaki, over the past 24 months including, any meeting notes or minutes.

On 8 August 2024, the Ministry contacted you asking you to refine your request due to the broad nature of your request. On 9 August 2024, the Ministry received an email from your Executive Assistant Lisa Lowe with a new request, which noted that your original request still stood.

The new request was:

- 3. Copies of any communications between the Taranaki Regional Public Service Commissioner, Gloria Campbell and anyone from Housing and Urban Development relating to housing issues and/or opportunities in the Taranaki Region, over the past 24 months, including any meeting notes or minutes.
- 4. Copies of any communications between the Taranaki Regional Public Service Commissioner, Gloria Campbell and police or other government departments related to rough sleepers or homeless in Taranaki, over the past 24 months including, any meeting notes or minutes.

I have considered your request under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act).

I am refusing questions 1, 2 and 4 as your request for all information is very broad, and substantial manual collation would be required to locate and prepare all documents within scope of your request. As such, I refuse these questions under section 18(f) of the Act. The greater public interest is in the effective and efficient administration of the public service.

I have considered whether the Ministry would be able to respond to your request given extra time, or the ability to charge for the information requested. I have concluded that, in either case, the Ministry's ability to undertake its work would still be prejudiced.

I note that the scope of your request for question 3 is specifically communications between Gloria Campbell and anyone at the Ministry of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) relating to housing issues and/or opportunities in the Taranaki region over the last 24 months, including any meeting notes or minutes. There are no specific meeting notes or minutes between Gloria Campbell and HUD in this period, however I am releasing the following emails to you:

- 1. Re_EH System Review Housing Supports (14 December 2022)
- 2. Re_HUD Response Transitional House for Roderique Hope Trust.msg (11 May 2023), plus attachment 'Inquiry Opportunity Template'
- 3. Rough Sleepers New Plymouth.msg (9 May 2024)
- 4. Rough sleeping on the rise in Waitara_Stuff.msg (20 May 2024)

Some information has been withheld from these emails under section 9(2)(a) of the Act in order to protect the privacy of natural persons.

Please note that there are agency or regional wide meetings and forums where both Gloria Campbell and HUD are present along with multiple other agencies, where housing is not the focus, however these meetings may include housing amongst multiple discussion topics.

I will be publishing this decision letter, with your personal details deleted, on the Ministry's website in due course.

Improvements to housing supports coming March 2023

Yesterday, when the Ministers announced changes following the Emergency Housing System Review, they also announced improvements to housing supports for the private rental market. We're really excited about the work we're doing on the new housing support programme.

The changes are aimed at improving how we better support low-to-middle income people to access and sustain housing in the private rental market.

We II be simplifying the products and making it easier to understand what support is available. Improvements will include:

- increasing maximum payments and the frequency of those payments
- removing set limits on assistance, so people can receive support for their actual costs
- creating one set of eligibility criteria
- aligning our systems, so all payments will be in CMS
- we're simplifying and streamlining the processes and rules for staff.

We'll also be exploring new ways to support people where existing housing products cannot be used.

The improved supports will help us 'act early' and be able to provide more support to more people more often.

We'll be sharing this news with our people on In the Loop and externally on the MSD website.

The improvements are likely to be available within the next few months.

Over the coming months, we'll reach out to share more information and engage about the new programme.

Closer to the time, we'll also reach out to clients, advocate groups and other key stakeholders about these exciting changes.

We've had the opportunity to get early ideas from some of our regions on how we might improve existing housing support products. We'd love to hear any other ideas you have on this. Send us an email with the Subject line as HSP's to housing portfolio@msd.govt.nz.

Thanks for your email.

Currently we are on track to achieve our Public Housing Plan 2021-2024 (PHP) intentions for transitional housing places in the Taranaki region. Te Tūāpapa Kura Kāinga Ministry of Housing and Urban Development acknowledges the significant work transitional housing providers have undertaken to meet these commitments and the valuable support they provide for communities and whānau.

Omaric

As you may be aware, the government's intent is to deliver transitional housing in regions where PHP supply is limited in the Bay of Plenty and West Coast Tasman regions.

However, HUD will consider additional transitional housing supply where regional PHP ranges have been achieved in some circumstances. The three key areas for additional supply are:

- · Supports exiting Covid response motels.
- New builds

- Where it meets public housing specifications
- Amount of supply is not excessive.
- Replacing old stock with new and better-quality properties
- Replacing properties where tenancies are ending, and the property is no longer used for transitional housing.

At this stage, unfortunately there is not too much we are able to do unless Roderique Hope Trust would like to swap this property out for an existing TH property within their portfolio.

Should this be something they would like to do, please have the trust complete the appropriate forms and provide these back to us here.
